POST-BACCALAUREATE INITIAL TEACHER CERTIFICATION

The Department of Teacher Education offers a post-baccalaureate certification-only program for candidates who wish to pursue teacher certification and hold at least a bachelor's degree. This program (a) consists of a minimum of 21 semester credit hours, (b) leads to initial teacher certification, and (c) is offered online except for the clinical practice components required by the Texas Education Agency. Courses from the certification-only route may be applied to a master's degree program if students are interested in a graduate degree.

Marketable Skills

Defined by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board's 60x30 Strategic Plan (https://reportcenter.highered.texas.gov/agency-publication/miscellaneous/thecb-60x30-strategic-plan/) as, "Those skills valued by employers that can be applied in a variety of work settings, including interpersonal, cognitive, and applied skills areas. Degree Requirements

Total Semester Credit Hours Required

21-27 semester credit hours (SCH) which includes 12 SCH of coursework in pedagogy and professional responsibilities and 6-12 SCH supervised teaching experience. Students have the option of adding ESL, Bilingual,

or Special Education supplemental (with added coursework) to the certification plan.

Special Requirements

Total SCHs

- Students complete early field experiences prior to clinical student teaching or professional internship. These experiences are designed to introduce students to diverse classroom settings and provide opportunities to generalize course content in an applied setting. Please refer to course descriptions for the number of field hours required for specific courses. The Office of Clinical Practices works with faculty to place students in approved districts; faculty will provide information about required assignments related to field experiences.
- Students must pass all TEXES exams prior to clinical student teaching or professional internship.
- Only courses in which the student achieved a grade of 'B' or higher may be included on the certification plan.
- Students are required to enroll in at least one semester credit hour
 of coursework each long semester (i.e., fall and spring) until they
 complete their program; failure to do so may result in removal from
 the program (and require re-applying if a student wishes to continue).
 Any exceptions require the permission of the M.A.T. Coordinator.
