

POST-MASTER'S CERTIFICATE OF ADVANCED STUDY - EDUCATIONAL DIAGNOSTICIAN

The Department of Teacher Education and the Special Education Program offer coursework leading to an Educational Diagnostician Certification. To obtain a recommendation for certification through Texas Woman's University, an individual must have a master's degree (preferably in education or an education-related field), three years of creditable teaching experience, a valid Texas teaching certificate, and completion of coursework on a plan of study leading to certification. After being admitted to the Graduate School and the Educational Diagnostician Program, the certification candidate must meet with his or her faculty advisor to develop a plan of study. The number of semester credit hours required and specific coursework varies depending on applicants' academic preparation and experience.
