

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPY

The master's degree in Marriage and Family Therapy prepares students for a career in marriage and family therapy. Based on a systems approach to interactions between individuals, families, and larger systems, students are empowered to conduct effective family therapy with diverse populations and are introduced to the role, process, and implications of research.

The program provides the academic and internship requirements to sit for the AMFTRB national exam and be eligible for licensure as a marriage and family therapist associate in Texas.

The M.S. in Marriage and Family Therapy is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Marriage and Family Therapy Education (COAMFTE).

Marketable Skills

Defined by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board's 60x30 Strategic Plan (<http://www.60x30tx.com/>) as, "Those skills valued by employers that can be applied in a variety of work settings, including interpersonal, cognitive, and applied skills areas. These skills can be either primary or complementary to a major and are acquired by students through education, including curricular, co-curricular, and extracurricular activities."

4. Ability to apply family therapy and family systems knowledge to professional practice.
5. Clinical skills using a systemic lens.

Admissions

Degree Requirements

Total Semester Credit Hours Required

Thesis or Non-thesis Option: 60 semester credit hours (SCH)

Clinical coursework includes at least 3 semesters of Internship in Family Therapy with 500 hours of direct client contact hours (including a minimum of 200 hours with couples or families) and 100 hours of supervision (including a minimum of 50 hours of supervision utilizing observable data).

Special Requirements

No grade below B is accepted towards any graduate degree in the Department of Human Development, Family Studies, and Counseling (HDFSC). If more than one grade below B is earned while enrolled in any HDFSC graduate program, the student will be dismissed from the program and will be ineligible to re-enroll in any program within the department for a period of six years.

Final Examination

Students complete a written capstone project and participate in an oral defense of the completed product. The capstone project is outlined in the Marriage and Family Therapy Student Handbook.
