Admissions

All applicants must meet the general undergraduate admission requirements (https://catalog.twu.edu/undergraduate/admission-information/).

The Application deadline for each semester is 5:00 p.m. on the last day of finals, as published on the Registrar's Calendar. Applications will be processed within three weeks of this deadline. Applications will not be accepted after the deadline, and failure to meet this condition will require the applicant to wait until the next semester's processing cycle for consideration. Please ensure your application has been submitted successfully by checking your TWU email for a confirmation of submission. If you have not received a confirmation email, please resubmit your application.

Additional admission requirements for the undergraduate psychology program are as follows:

- 1. completion of 45 semester credit hours,
- completion of PSY 1013, PSY 1603, and PSY 2513 with a grade of C or higher; and PSY 2013 with a grade of B or higher.
- consistent adherence to the Psychology Program Code of Professional Conduct policy (https://docs.google.com/document/ d/1SPMhuY7FHv0PklrpFWZ-gxBaYCt4Nblnps_NoP59-D8/edit/? usp=sharing) and,
- completion of the Psychology Major Application (https://forms.gle/ vMhVp2oA9tCFJUYj6/).

Students will initially enter as pre-psychology majors. Acceptance into the Psychology program is contingent upon meeting departmental requirements. Many psychology courses require that students be a

Psychology major prior to enrollment. Therefore, it is important that students complete the departmental admissions process as soon as admission requirements are met. Continued enrollment in the program is contingent upon completion of psychology and philosophy coursework with a C or higher and continued adherence to the Psychology Program Code of Professional Conduct policy (https://docs.google.com/document/d/1SPMhuY7FHv0PkIrpFWZ-gxBaYCt4NbInps_NoP59-D8/edit/?usp=sharing).
