The B.S. in Family Studies with a Family and Consumer Sciences emphasis prepares students for careers focused on family and community services, consumerism, and education. The course content allows students to develop an interdisciplinary, broad-based view of how people interact with and are shaped by their environments. It is not a certification degree, so students interested in teacher certification within the field of Family and Consumer Sciences will need additional course work and training after the completion of the degree.
